

Obtaining Lost/Replacement Examination Certificates

Examination certificates are normally issued to centres (schools/colleges) within 10 weeks of the publication of results. Each centre will determine the most appropriate method of distributing the certificates to the candidates.

If you have not received your examination certificate, please contact the centre where you sat the examination in the first instance. But please note that centres are only obliged to retain unclaimed certificates for one year from the date of issue.

If your school or college no longer have your examination certificates or you have lost them, you will need to go onto each awarding body website and follow their links to 'lost/replacement certificates' page, linked below.
